"Maria Espinoza was 18 years old when she had an abortion in Mexico; in her 30s she found healing and forgiveness in Detroit

About To Do Great Things

When one of her most faithful Rachel's Vineyard volunteers cried, "I can't do this," Mary Huston replied, "No you can't, but God will. Welcome to RV."

That one statement does a good job of summing up Mary's life.

Both of her parents came from situations that brought wounds into their marriage. Unfortunately, tragedies that occurred while they were married only exacerbated their unhealed emotions. Before Mary was born, one of her sisters died from pneumonia a year after her birth. Two years later, her brother passed away the day after he was born. This affected her father even more, and like so many, he took it out in anger. Things worsened with time. He became manic-depressive, and the family never knew when he would explode – verbally, emotionally, or physically.

That made home life precarious, at best.

Mary always knew her parents loved her. But as a teenager, she just wanted to escape from the chaos and pain. She began "looking for love in all the wrong places" and while dating her boyfriend, found herself in an unplanned pregnancy. Turning to her mother for help, Mary was warned about what her father might do if he found out. Despite her boyfriend's willingness to marry her, the people around her strongly encouraged an abortion, and Mary went along with it. The topic was never brought up again, but the abortion created a schism in Mary's relationship with her mother and her boyfriend.

Her boyfriend left the relationship, and a few months later, at the age of 19, Mary, her mother, brother, and younger sister, Roberta (who has Down Syndrome), left the house. They had tried getting help for their father, but the only option they saw for safety was leaving home.

They struggled to make ends meet. But God always provided through family and friends.

When she was 22 years old, Mary's brother went into a coma unexpectedly. The date was August 23. She vividly remembers her mother running to their favorite saint, St. Thérèse, and asking for her help. On October 1, her Feast Day, "St. Thérèse was there for my brother when he passed," Mary says softly. Two years later, her mother got sick. She suffered for three years before dying. Mary wasn't even 30 yet, and the two people she was closest to were gone.

But Mary's oldest sister, Ann, who was married, stepped in to raise Roberta. Her older brother, too, did what he could to help. Once again, God gave Mary the strength and ability to continue. As He created circumstances that helped her through this difficult time, she began to open her heart more and turn to Him.

Eventually, she started her own ad agency and moved to Florida. Returning fully to the Catholic Church, she confessed her abortion and later met the man of her dreams. She was blessed with a good marriage, and from the outside things looked good. “Everyone thought I was very happy and at peace,” Mary says, “but I wasn’t.”

One day, early in her marriage, she was listening to Catholic Radio and heard the commentators talk about Rachel’s Vineyard Ministries in another city. “That sounds great,” she thought, “Maybe one day.”

Less than 24 hours later, a friend called her and said that Rachel’s Vineyard was coming to Jacksonville. “Can you help market it?” she excitedly asked Mary.

Looking back, Mary laughs, “It was as if God was telling me, ‘You said, maybe one day. Well, that one day is today.’”

Mary called the Director of Rachel’s Vineyard in Jacksonville, and during their conversation, she began to cry. The dam finally broke. That Director, now her lifelong friend, Donna, encouraged Mary to bring her husband and emailed a letter that helps retreatants prepare for the weekend. Mary printed the letter and handed it to her husband. He read it, looked at her, and asked, “You want me to go with you?” “Yes,” she replied. Even though he had nothing to do with her abortion, she wanted him to go with her. She wanted him to understand what she had been through and to be part of her healing. She didn’t want to come home and continue to be alone in her pain. He agreed to go.

From that point until the retreat began, every morning tears streamed down her face, along with memories that were buried long ago. But during the retreat, Mary not only forgave herself and saw her own life with new eyes, she saw the suffering her own parents had been through in their lives, understood how hard it was for them, and started to forgive them, too.

The retreat filled the hole in her heart that she wasn’t even aware of and gave her the chance to name—and unite with—her daughter, Gabrielle Rose. It also restored her joy and strengthened her marriage. To this day, her husband says it was healing for him, as well.

Mary was finally free.

Soon afterwards, Mary started seeing a spiritual director, and in one of their visits, she was told that God would speak to her. The next time she went to Adoration, she looked at Jesus and said, “My spiritual director said you were going to speak to me, so speak, Lord, your servant is listening.” Mary was still and quiet. Then she heard God speak, “I want you to forgive your mother.”

“I already forgave her,” Mary began to say, but stopped short of finishing. “Of course, Lord,” she thought, “I haven’t.”

Mary returned to her spiritual director, who helped her through the process of forgiving her mother. Later, she realized it was the week of her mother’s birthday. Although her mother had been gone for 36 years, Mary sang “Happy Birthday” to her—like a restored little girl who loved her mother wholeheartedly once again.

Although she came from a musical family and loved to write songs, Mary hadn’t written anything since the abortion. “It was like my brain shut down,” she states.

“But just one day after the retreat, an entire song came to my mind for the first time in 20 years.” Mary attributes that to Rachel’s Vineyard. “I know the power of God and the unbelievable healing of Jesus Christ,” she says firmly. “The retreats don’t just heal the heart and soul but also the brain.”

Many years have come and gone since her retreat. Mary is now the Leader for the Jacksonville, Florida, team. She chuckles remembering that after becoming the Leader, she learned they didn’t have a place to hold the retreat. “We did a nine-day Novena to St. Thérèse,” she says. “I told the team, ‘At the end of this Novena, we’re going to have a place.’ And we did, thanks to God and the support and help of our priests and friends.”

Before any logistical preparations for the retreat, the team gets spiritually prepared first, through prayer, Mass, and Adoration. “There is a battle,” she says. “We’re a group of volunteers who know we’re human and will mess up. But God is more powerful than the battle.”

And He’s proven His power to Mary throughout her life. What she couldn’t do on her own, God did. He helped her family when things seemed hopeless. He helped her sing and laugh again. He helped her forgive her parents. She tells others that the Lord wants to reconcile everything, even situations that seem impossible: while Mary’s father was still alive, the Lord helped heal their relationship, too.

Mary is so grateful for the support of her older brother and sister, extended family, friends, priests, and the Church. She knows that Rachel’s Vineyard is God’s ministry. It belongs to Him. So she prays daily for His blessings and encouragement on her family, friends, and ministry volunteers. “When we follow Him, listen to Him, love Him, and support each other, we can love others, and—especially post-abortive women and men—bring them to Rachel’s Vineyard,” she says. “Time and again we are given circumstances that remind us to totally depend on God, who will always provide and is about to do great things.”

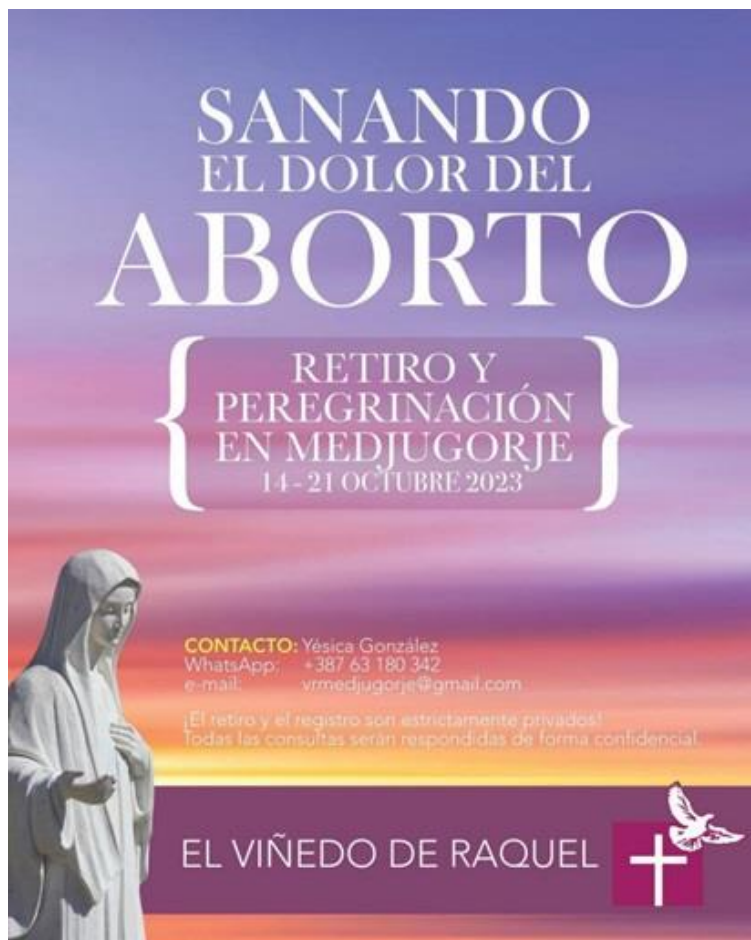
