Mother's Day is the Perfect Time for Clergy and Pastors to Share a Message of Hope and Healing for those Wounded by Abortion

We asked a number of religious leaders over the years if they would consider addressing the topic of abortion loss and healing as part of their Mother's Day message. The typical response; "I don't think this is the right time to address this sensitive topic with my congregation."

But the truth is, women healed of their abortion experience have taught us that Mother's day is actually the perfect time to share a message of hope and healing. Women who have had abortions may be experiencing various levels of regret and discomfort as our nation honors its moms.

Ashley shares an experience of Mother's Day in her faith community:

"At the close of our Sunday service, the pastor asked all mothers to stand for a special Mother's Day blessing for all moms in the congregation. At those times, I wanted to run out of the church, or cry out in pain. But I sat there in silence and shame. See, many years earlier, I aborted two of my children.

Because of the physical damaged caused by those procedures, I was left infertile. It would have been such a blessing on Mother's Day to hear a message from the pastor that also acknowledged the motherhood of those who lost children to abortion, and an invitation to a deeper emotional and spiritual healing of that experience."

Susan Swander, a Rachel's Vineyard leader in Oregon shares:

"Yes, Mother's Day can be a hard day for women with abortion loss. But it can also be a day for those women to celebrate being mothers."

How is it possible that this secret and shameful event from the past - can be a cause for celebration?

When mothers like Susan go through an abortion recovery program they come to understand, and more importantly, intimately experience a new reality.

As they progress through the steps of spiritual and emotional healing, they are set free to develop an *emotional reconnection as mother* with their child (or children) lost to abortion, and nurture a *spiritual relationship* with their children, entrusted to the Lord of Life.

Susan shares:

“So many women who have had abortions never thought of themselves as mothers...after my [Rachel's Vineyard healing retreat](#), Mother's Day became a day for me to honor and celebrate my three aborted children & one miscarried.”

Time to Light up God's House!

Jesus tells us in Matthew's Gospel:

No one lights a lamp and then puts it under a basket. Instead, a lamp is placed on a stand, where it gives light to everyone in the house.

Don't leave this message of hope and healing under a basket. Share this article with your pastor or other person in pastoral leadership in your faith community.

If you have experienced abortion loss and attended an abortion recovery program, offer to meet with a leader from your church to share your experience, and offer support and encouragement in their outreach to women and men wounded by abortion.

Let the light of reconciliation and healing shine brightly for God's people!

Show Compassion to Post-Abortive Women

I've been told by priests that offering confessions at a Rachel's Vineyard for healing after abortion can be among the most moving confessions they hear. One priest remarked that he almost envied those at the retreat. He explained that through their suffering, they deeply experienced both the incredible redemptive power of the Cross and the tender intimacy of Jesus' healing love.

Just as those who struggle with addiction often cannot imagine a life free of addiction, those who are suffering from the consequences of the choice of abortion, often cannot imagine a life free from the physical, mental and spiritual pain they have endured, often for decades. Perhaps not even realizing the source of their suffering.

Negative reactions experienced in the aftermath of an abortion can include nightmares and flashbacks, difficulty sleeping or controlling anger, difficulty bonding with other children, addictions, promiscuity, anxiety, panic attacks, or depression. Multiple studies indicate that women who terminated a pregnancy can have a three to sixfold increase in suicide rates, compared to women who gave birth. Sometimes these reactions appear immediately, but it can be years before they surface. The delayed onset can obscure the connection between their suffering and the abortion.

Often feeling estranged from God, many post-abortive women and men would never dare to imagine the longing that our Lord has for them to find healing in his embrace. Yet Jesus came to heal the sick. Of the dozens of miracles which manifested Jesus' power, most were healing miracles. Jesus performed miracles to demonstrate his divinity, but he also set an example for us. In healing the sick, Jesus broke the chain of suffering over people's lives and brought them abundant life. He calls us to do the same.

Rachel's Vineyard continues that healing work. Healing in Jesus' name shows the love of God in action. But how to reach those in need of healing? "Your faith has saved you," Jesus often said. But what of those who do not yet dare to have faith? For them, we can look to the story of the paralytic, whose friends had faith enough to lower him through the roof so that he might receive healing. "When Jesus saw their faith, he said to the paralytic, *'Child, your sins are forgiven,'*" later commanding him to rise, pick up his mat and go home (Mk 2:5).

Do we have faith enough to reach out to our friends to bring them to Jesus' healing? Where their hearts can be mended and their sins forgiven? It can be risky to approach someone in such pain. Yet, just as Jesus initiated the building of the Kingdom of God with his healing miracles, so too are we called to continue his example.

Society has embraced a counterfeit view of compassion, demanding acceptance of a tragic choice, rather than offering healing from its consequences. True compassion offers healing, love and forgiveness, leading to renewed life and joy. Acknowledging the pain of abortion does not inflict pain. Rather it eases it, bringing it into the light. Your words, your compassion can bring a friend to new life in Jesus.

Another Shot

"I was a hellion growing up." Even though Jody Duffy said this in a phone conversation, you could almost see the sparkle in her eyes.

Growing up in suburban Chicago, she was the youngest of three children, "a tomboy," and a child who suffered from ADHD in an era where no one knew what that was.

Interestingly, her desire to be a rock star helped curb some of the ADHD symptoms she experienced. In 5th grade, she became a drummer in the marching band. The drumming – which incorporates one's hands and feet – actually helped calm her down. She stayed with it through high school and also started a rock band, in which she was the lead singer. Typical of the era, their band's name was "BAD."

After high school, Jody went on to college and then Officer Candidate School in Fort Benning. While she was there, she met a lieutenant, and they started dating. He took things further than she intended.

Then she discovered she was pregnant.

In shock, with no idea of what to do, she took the guidance of a friend, who thought he was helping by making an appointment for her to get an abortion.

She went through with it but was humiliated by the entire experience. Afterwards, she went to a Catholic church and asked God to forgive her. "I want to live the rest of my life being a good person," she prayed in earnest. "I want to meet a

Christian man.”

A month later she met her husband. They married, had 3 boys, and as you would expect, life got busy. As their children grew older, they started a family band. Mom played drums and their three sons played guitars and sang the music of their generation from groups like Guns & Roses, Metallica, and Pearl Jam.

Whenever feelings about her abortion surfaced, she “pushed them down, like a Jack-in-the-Box.” And she was successful at that for almost 20 years – until she got asthmatic pneumonia. The doctor prescribed multiple steroids, which prevented her from sleeping. She tried praying. She tried pushing “Jack” down. But he kept popping up. “I was falling to pieces,” she says, “but I didn’t want the kids to see.” When they were at school, she’d prostrate herself on her bedroom floor, asking Jesus to help her. One day after begging His help, she heard the devil’s voice saying clearly, “Jody, why did you even bother to ask? He will never forgive you for that.”

Instantly, all hope was vanished.

But as she drove the kids to school the next day, with her favorite Christian radio station playing in the background, the broadcaster started interviewing someone about healing after abortion. Jody was stunned. “What? You can get healing for that?” she wondered in amazement. Listening intently, she learned about the book *Her Choice to Heal*, bought it, and savored every word. A few days later, she saw a promotion for the ProLife Mass at the oldest church in Atlanta. “I don’t do pro-life stuff,” she said to herself. But the thought kept gnawing at her, like another Jack-in-the-Box that couldn’t be squelched.

She finally acquiesced and got directions to Atlanta’s Shrine of the Immaculate Conception from her husband.

As the Mass began, she saw dozens of high school students process down the aisle, each one carrying a cross labeled with one of the years since the landmark decision of Roe vs. Wade. The procession line seemed endless. Jody watched silently until she saw the year of her abortion. “I lost it,” she says quietly.

After the Mass she meandered to the basement, where pro-life vendors were handing out brochures. She started “picking stuff up, and once I got home, I sifted through everything.” That’s when she discovered Atlanta’s PATH (Post Abortion Treatment and Healing) program and went to their Bible Study. Later, when they got involved with Rachel’s Vineyard, she went on a retreat and finally found the healing, forgiveness, and peace she had been yearning for. She worked with PATH’s Board of Directors, getting funding so that veterans and military could attend the retreats at little or no cost.

That’s when she discovered the shocking statistics about abortions in the military. A 2013 study found that unintended pregnancy in the armed forces is 50% higher than the general population. One reason for this is the sexual coercion and assault that many women face. Another is because they can’t get deployed while pregnant. This leads many women to opt for abortion – and then return to their duty as if nothing had happened.

It was eerie how much that mirrored Jody’s experience.

After she found healing through PATH and Rachel’s Vineyard, she became involved in both programs. In 2015 she was asked to become the Director of

PATH, which she gratefully accepted. Five years later, she stepped down to work in another capacity. It had become clear that God wanted her to develop a healing program specifically for “military, veterans, and their families” – bringing them the same healing, the same mercy, the same hope that she received so many years ago.

That mercy has been an underlying theme in her life. But it wasn't until she learned about St. Faustina and Divine Mercy that she fully understood it. Jesus “took somebody so ordinary to tell the world about His Mercy. It's there for everyone. Particularly for those who have had an abortion,” she says – and then adds, “He never gave up on me.”

Today Jody is still married, still plays the drums, and still sings in a band. This band is called “Last Shot,” but as she experienced when driving her children to school that morning – and then through Divine Mercy – as long as we have breath, we have another “shot” to find peace, healing, and forgiveness.

RV Recommends: “Pro-Choice Pro-Adoption: It’s Time for a Loving, Positive Response to Unplanned Pregnancy” By Terri Marcroft

You or someone you know has an unplanned pregnancy – now what? Here in the US, we fall readily into two camps: the abortion camp or the keep the baby/single parent camp. In fact, the US has the highest rate of teen and unplanned pregnancies. Moreover, we have some of the highest abortion rates among Western Countries. But is there another option and does anyone really consider it?

Theresa Marcroft has effectively written a book that addresses the many issues surrounding abortion or single parenting while re-introducing the choice of adoption. She dispels the old notions about adoption and brings to light the positive outcomes of open adoption not just for the baby but for the birth parents and the adoptive parents. Why is it, then, that only 1% of women with an unplanned pregnancy choose adoption? Simple, it's an alternative that is not suggested. Terri includes many touching stories from birth parents, adoptive parents, and adoptees that illustrate how beautiful adoption can be. She goes onto to point out the importance for communities to support women in 2 areas: provide the information that leads to an informed choice about the unwanted pregnancy, particularly, adoption as a very positive and viable option;

provide support before, during, and after the adoption process that will empower her. Additionally, suggesting adoption as a course of action should not be regulated to a pregnancy crisis center. It needs to be vocalized within the woman's circle of influence: the birth father, parents, grandparents, church, medical community, employer, etc.

Terri Marcroft's book is informative, yet offers guidance, tips, and excellent "Care" Resources. This book should be made accessible to schools, churches, ob/gyn offices, and pregnancy centers.
